

to support Ukrainian students through the MPI Poland Chapter is a perfect example of the important work conducted by the MPI Foundation," recounts Antonio Ducceschi, 2024 vice chair of finance for the MPIF Global Board of Trustees.

"This initiative was impactful as it provided crucial financial support to ensure the continuity of education for Ukrainian students affected by the war," he says. "Without this funding, many of these students would have faced significant disruptions in their studies. This effort not only highlighted the foundation's commitment to education but also demonstrated our ability to respond swiftly and effectively to global crises, ensuring that students could continue their academic pursuits."

Meeting industry support like this has been at the heart of the MPI Foundation since its creation in 1984. The non-profit organization, spearheaded by the all-volunteer Global Board of Trustees, is the leading meeting and event industry foundation

devoted to funding grants, scholarships and pan-industry research for the people who need it most.

"Making our industry and community the best version of ourselves is what really drives us," says Kevin Kirby, executive director of the MPI Foundation. "In 2023 alone, the MPIF distributed 251 grants and scholarships. Over the past 40 years, the MPIF has acted on behalf of our members, chapters and industry, distributing over \$14.4 million across our global community."

Kirby says that beyond raising funds through donations from individuals, chapters and organizations, MPIF leaders have sought to make the connection to the meetings community more profound at the 40-year mark through a "Celebrate the power of good!" theme.

"Our success is measured by ensuring we maximize our grants and scholarships distribution," he says. "While how much we raise is important, it's equally as important to know that through 40 years, we have helped over 25,000 individuals."

## THERE'S NEVER A WRONG TIME TO DO THE RIGHT THING

The MPI Foundation is continually seeking to expand and enhance the scope and breadth of its service to MPI members. Brad Dean, a current member of the Global Board of Trustees, says one initiative that stands out to him occurred early on during the pandemic, when the meeting industry was severely impacted by travel restrictions and public health concerns.

"Everyone was very concerned about the future of in-person meetings, and some were even suggesting that in-person meetings might never return to the levels we had become accustomed to," he says. "The MPI staff, Global Board of Trustees and International Board of Directors were all unified in our belief that not only would meetings return, but their importance would soar post-pandemic as we would value in-person meetings even more (thankfully, we were right). After much discussion and thoughtful analysis, we unanimously voted to invest as much of our MPIF funds, including reserves, as was possible to keep professional planners engaged and educated throughout the crisis."

Other recent initiatives by the MPIF include providing support to the community in Hawaii impacted by the tragic wildfires in 2023 and providing a grant to develop an anti-human trafficking education program for use at all MPI chapters to support efforts to stop the horrors of human trafficking.

#### A PART OF SOMETHING BIGGER

MPI Foundation contributions to the industry run the gamut, including underwriting the CMM program, research/studies (including IACC's "Meeting Room of the Future" and an analysis of the comprehensive economic impact of the meeting industry), grants that help MPI chapters provide important education (such as the MPI Connecticut River Valley Chapter's nighttime dinner and education combo session with a medical meetings focus) and a grant supporting HelmsBriscoe's HB Cares Autism Work Experience Project.

An MPIF grant helped the MPI Denmark Chapter host a one-day training course using the Event Design Canvas methodology. Former chapter president Anne Dalgaard says the grant made it possible for the chapter to offer members a certificate course on top of the "ordinary" seminars—a more substantial educational offering than was previously available.

"The course went really well—it was beneficial to the attendees, interactive and highly educational. The course received a satisfaction score of 4.8 on a five-point scale," she says. "An educational offer like this makes it possible for us to show our members that there is more to MPI than our local seminars—that we are part of something bigger!"

Countless individuals have benefitted from MPIF scholarships that enabled them to become MPI members or attend important events such as the World Education Congress (WEC) and European Meetings & Events Conference (EMEC).



MPI Foundation Global Board of Trustees ated hundreds of thousands of dollars for the foundation. The second was a mind shift that challenged the chapters to hold a local fundraiser within their community—proceeds would come to the foundation and then a large percent of that would be given back to the contributing chapter for education, training, etc. We called it '5K can go a long way!' We encouraged 5K races and asked each chapter to shoot for a \$5,000 donation to the foundation."

#### **SECURING FUTURE SUCCESS**

Although we're celebrating the 40th anniversary of the MPI Foundation by taking a look back, it's important to note that the MPIF is not going anywhere. To help ensure its ongoing legacy, an endowment was established during the tenure of Jim Russell, 2016-2018 chair of the MPI Foundation Global Board of Trustees.

"This endowment is intended to eventually provide enough returns to support the operating costs of the MPI Foundation," Russell says. "That way, we achieve closer to a dollar-for-dollar contribution to benefit ratio. Every dollar given to the foundation goes back out to the community vs. supporting operating costs."

Russell says he's been blessed to have so many friends in the industry that also serve the community.

"I've found that there are so many in our industry that you simply cannot out-give! Not just in dollars, of course, but with inspiration, servanthood and mentorship," he says. "I'd love to challenge everyone to get involved in the MPI Foundation...I guarantee you will get more than you expect. You will serve alongside like-minded industry leaders and make an impact on this amazing community we are privileged to be a part of."

Looking ahead, Ducceschi believes the MPIF will play a crucial role in shaping the future of the meeting industry by investing in the younger generations.

# Creating cutting-edge research

At the annual Thought Leaders Summit, the MPI Foundation convenes the profession's best to look at events in new ways—resulting in insights that move your industry forward.

#### THE MPI FOUNDATION CONVENES THE MEET-

ing and event industry's top leaders for its annual Thought Leaders Summit to discuss, ideate and problem-solve critical challenges such as AI, safety, diversity and inclusion and designing the future of work.

Julie Holtgrave, CMP, deputy director of operations & education initiatives for the American College of Lifestyle Medicine, has attended several Thought Leaders Summits and calls the experience "exceptional."

"Each one is very different—the content is different, the dynamic of the attendees is different," she says. "The level of the conversations and the challenges that I encounter as a meeting professional bring a context to what I do and help me to solve problems. You experience second-to-none hospitality, and participating is definitely a highlight of my year."

Recent host cities have included Buffalo, N.Y., and Mobile, Ala. The 2024 Thought Leaders Summit in Indianapolis featured two education tracks: food waste prevention and neuroinclusion.

"The education sessions at the Thought Leaders Summit are challenging," Holtgrave says. "They challenge you to think outside the box.

The other attendees challenge you to think in ways that you may not have thought of before, using a different lens and a different filter to think about how your events come together and how it might impact your attendees. It's very different than sitting at the World Education Congress and hearing different operational and facilitation concepts for your events. This goes a little deeper, and it definitely is something that applies more to the senior-level planner."

The MPI Foundation also funds important industry research, such as economic impact studies that demonstrate the true value of the meeting industry in different countries/regions. White papers based on Thought Leaders Summit education are one of the important research-focused projects that benefit from MPI Foundation support.

The following is an excerpt from "Neuroinclusion Next: Meeting and Event Design," one of the white papers based on the 2024 Thought Leaders Summit in Indianapolis, where attendees earned the Event Welfare Champion: Neurodiversity & Experience Design certificate, developed by Google's The Neu Project & EventWell.

People who are neurodivergent make up 20% of the global population, according to The Neu Project. The term "neurodivergent" refers to "neurologically divergent from typical" and includes developmental, acquired and mental health.

These numbers have profound implications for meeting and event planners. Not only do neurodivergent



people tend to find it harder to participate in events due to sensory overload, crowds, noise and lighting, among other factors, they are also less likely to go altogether because of the stress they anticipate it will cause them.
